The New Years Eve Incident


- Collegiate prestige is not that deep.

- No, I do not recommend this to anyone.


Everything will fall into place.

Chancing: The Numbers Game




PARAMETERS FOR CHANCING

Chancing is the process of approximating your chances of acceptance (safety, target, reach) based on a school's past published numbers.

- X SAT/ACT
- AP, SAT II, IB, competitive exams.
- GPA, transcripts








What do the numbers show?

- GPA: 3.79 means that students who were admitted scored almost all As and some Bs in their classes
- Weighted GPA tells you that most students took more than 1 AP class to boost their GPA, which is also reinforced by the "Average Number of AP Exam Scores Submitted by a Student."
- X SAT: Middle 50% of students who were admitted to NC State in 2019 had scores between 1270 and 1410. These scores are in the 86th percentile or above.



How do you assess yourself?

To be a COMPETITIVE applicant:


- GPA: You should be a majorly A/B student with at least 2 AP course weights factored in.
- AP: number of APs doesn't matter but it does manipulate your GPA.
- SAT: If you are between 1270 and 1410, you have a good chance. The higher up that scale, the higher your chances. The lower down, the more you will need to make up for it in other parts of your application. Same thing applies to ACT.



What are this student's chances?

- 3.50 uGPA, 4.11 wGPA.
- × SAT 1280
- X AP Psych 3
- X Key club 3 years (no major achievement), lacrosse team 4 years.

Low High Chance Chance



What are this student's chances?

- 3.84 uGPA, 4.26 wGPA.
- × SAT 1380
- AP Psych 4, AP Chem 4, AP Bio 3, AP Calc AB/BC 3.
- Student council (vice president), soup kitchen volunteer.





- Lower stats ≠ denial (you will have to work more on other parts to balance your application)
- 2. Higher stats ≠ acceptance (you still have to put in effort on other parts of your application)


